Mandy Wallstead graduated from Holton High School in 2012. As a Cross Country and Track athlete, Wallstead set school records and left a legacy for future Holton athletes.

As a two-year Cross Country runner, Wallstead established herself as a fast, positive, and hardworking athlete. She is currently the 9th fastest Cross Country runner in school history. Wallstead qualified for the State Finals in Cross Country making her Holton's first Division IV female runner to qualify and only the second ever in school history.

In her four-year Track career, Wallstead dominated in 100 meter hurdles and long jump. She currently holds the school record in the 100 meter hurdles with a time of 17.32 seconds set during her senior year at MHSAA Regionals. She also holds the school record for long jump with a jump of 16 feet, 3 inches set during her junior year at the conference championship. Wallstead qualified for the MHSAA State Finals in both the 100 meter hurdles and long jump. She was recognized in multiple years as the Most Valuable Player on the track team.

After high school, Wallstead has helped guide younger athletes at Holton. She has gone on to become a School Counselor and a purple belt in jiu-jitsu. Wallstead's hard work and athletic success make her a worthy inductee into the Holton Athletics Hall of Fame.
